He likes to

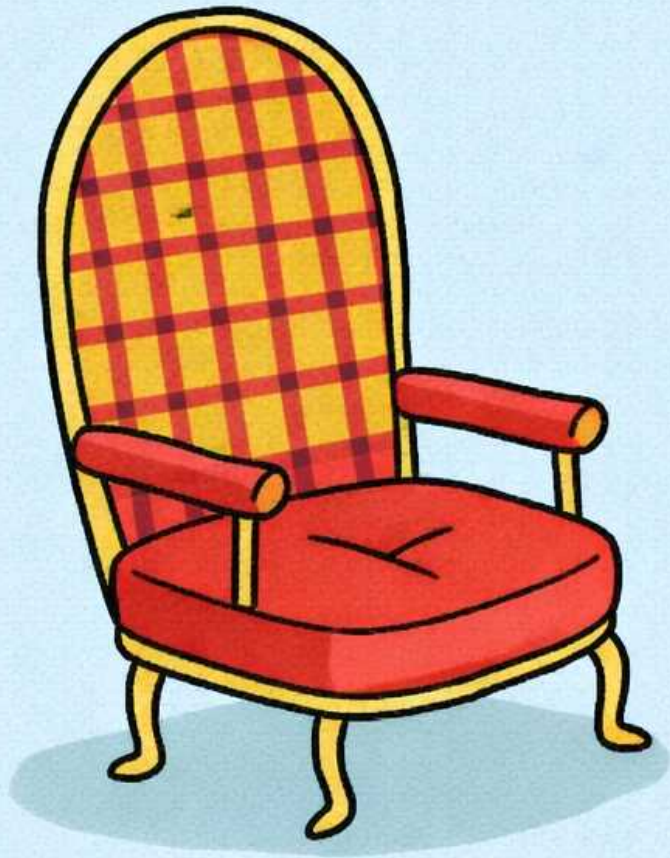
spoil me with

The boy holds up his brush full of yellow paint. He asks if he can paint her face so he can see her. She keeps still and waits.

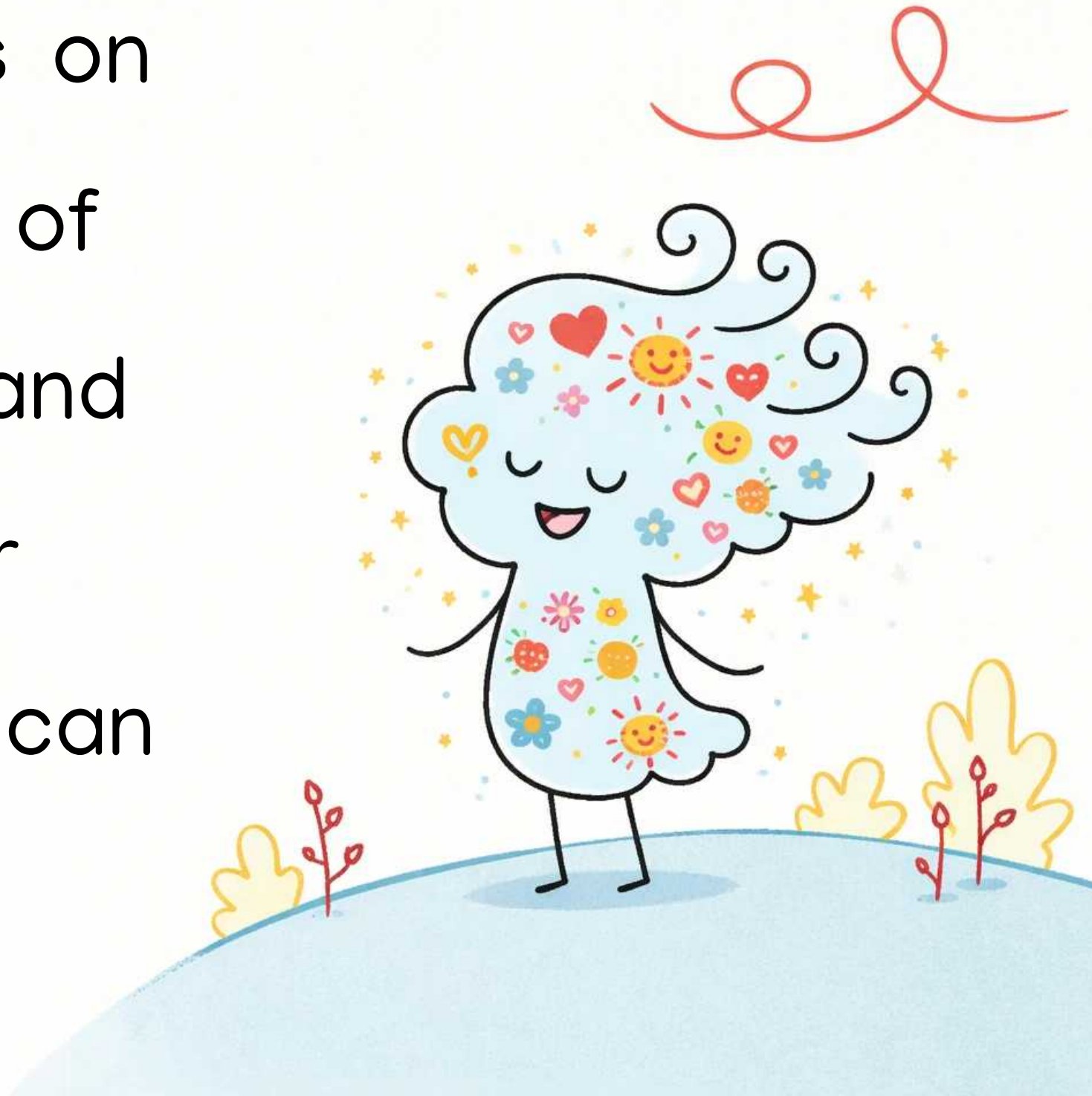
The girl jumps
