the mix. 'Hmm.'

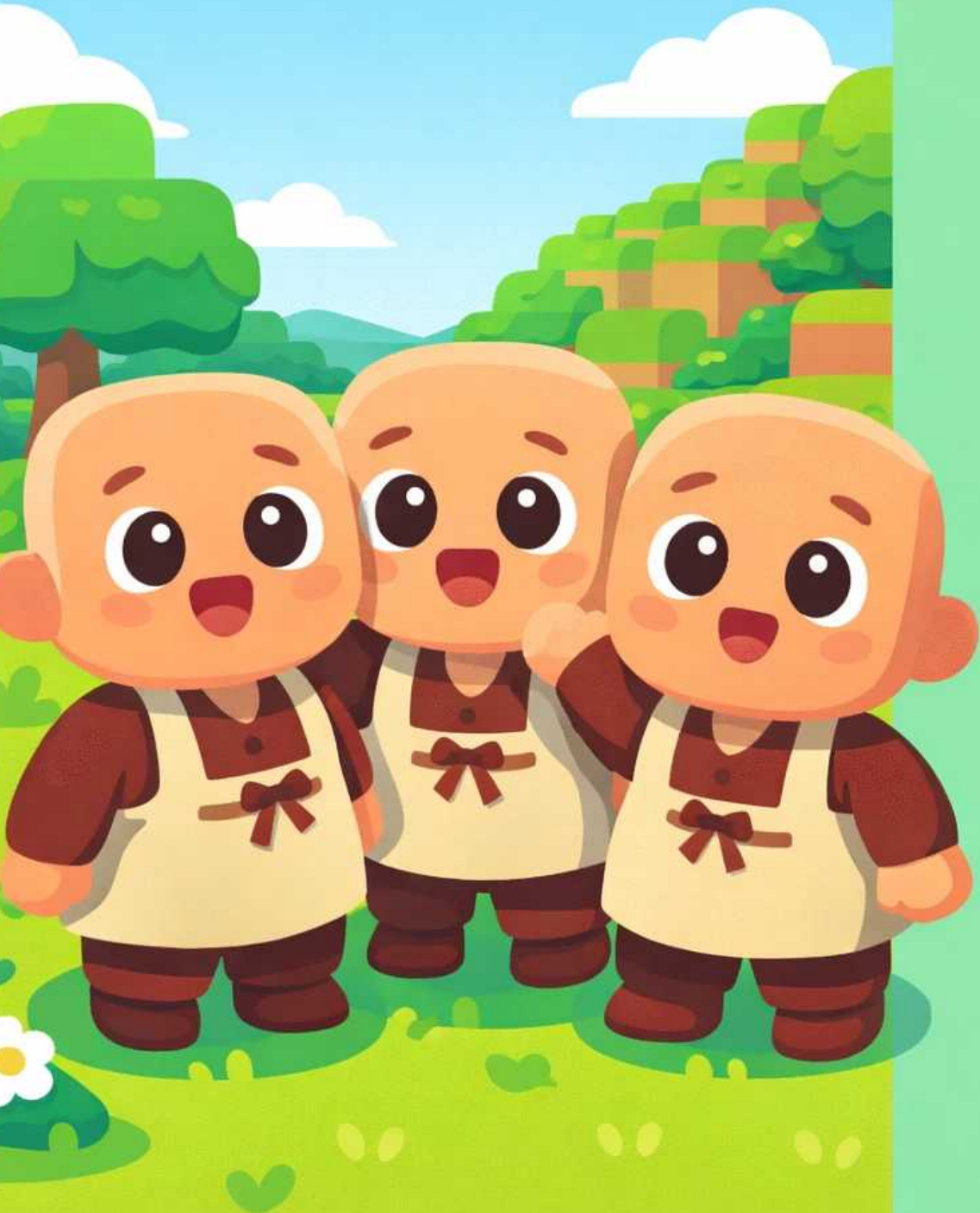




Next, the white cows. Zom pours from a gold flask. Sweet drops drip in. 'White cow, white milk!' he says with joy.
