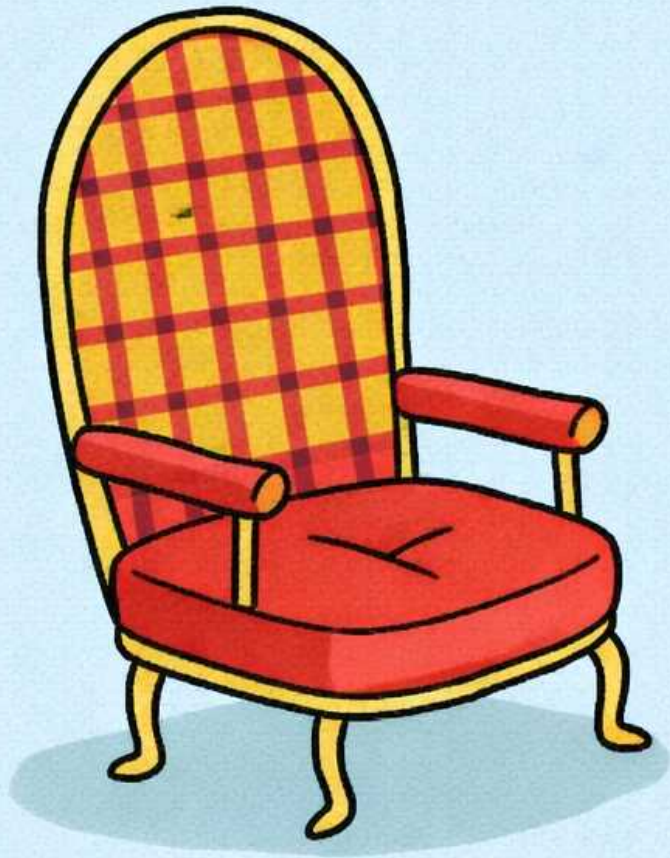




This is
