wet.





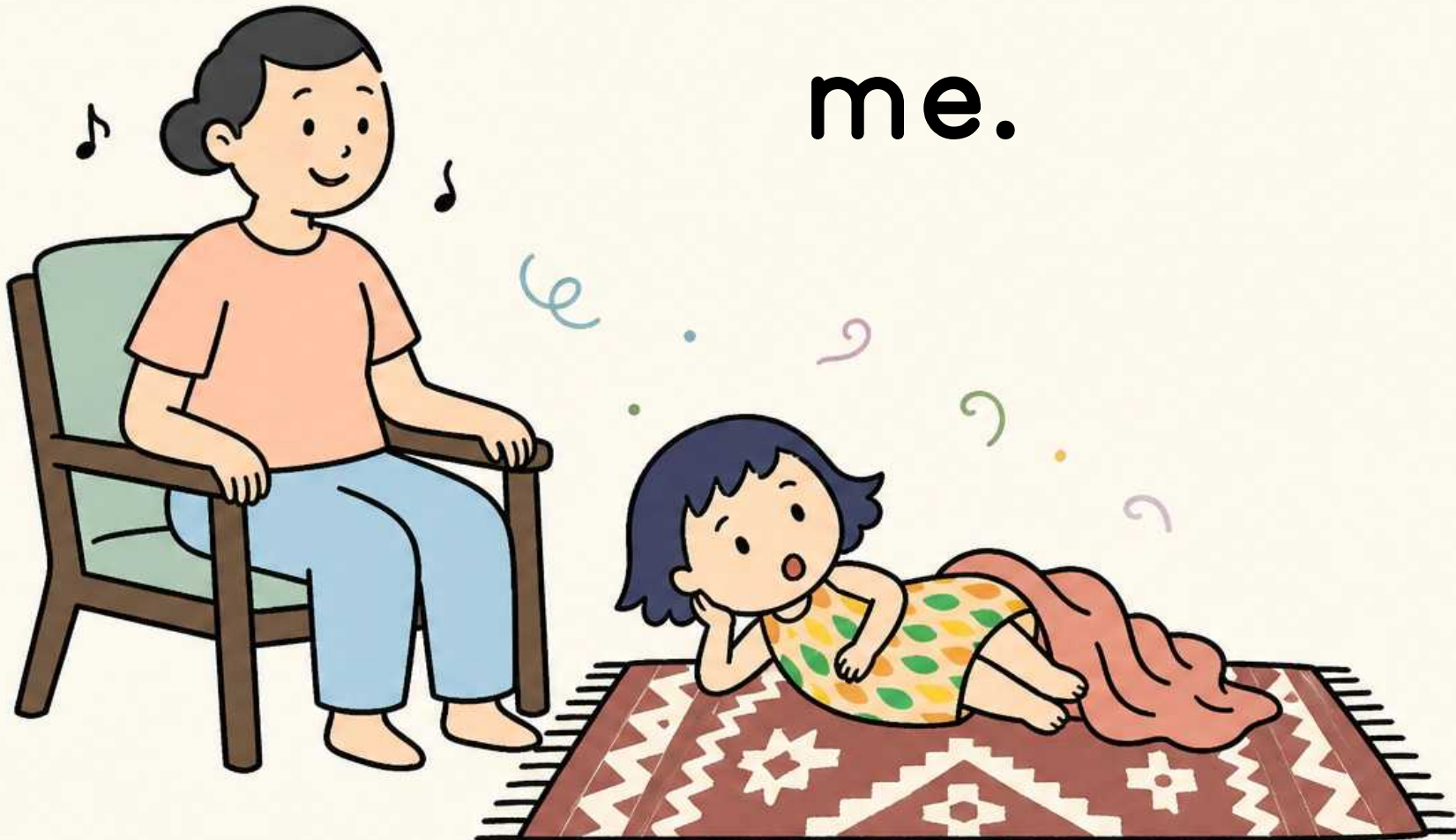
We go so
