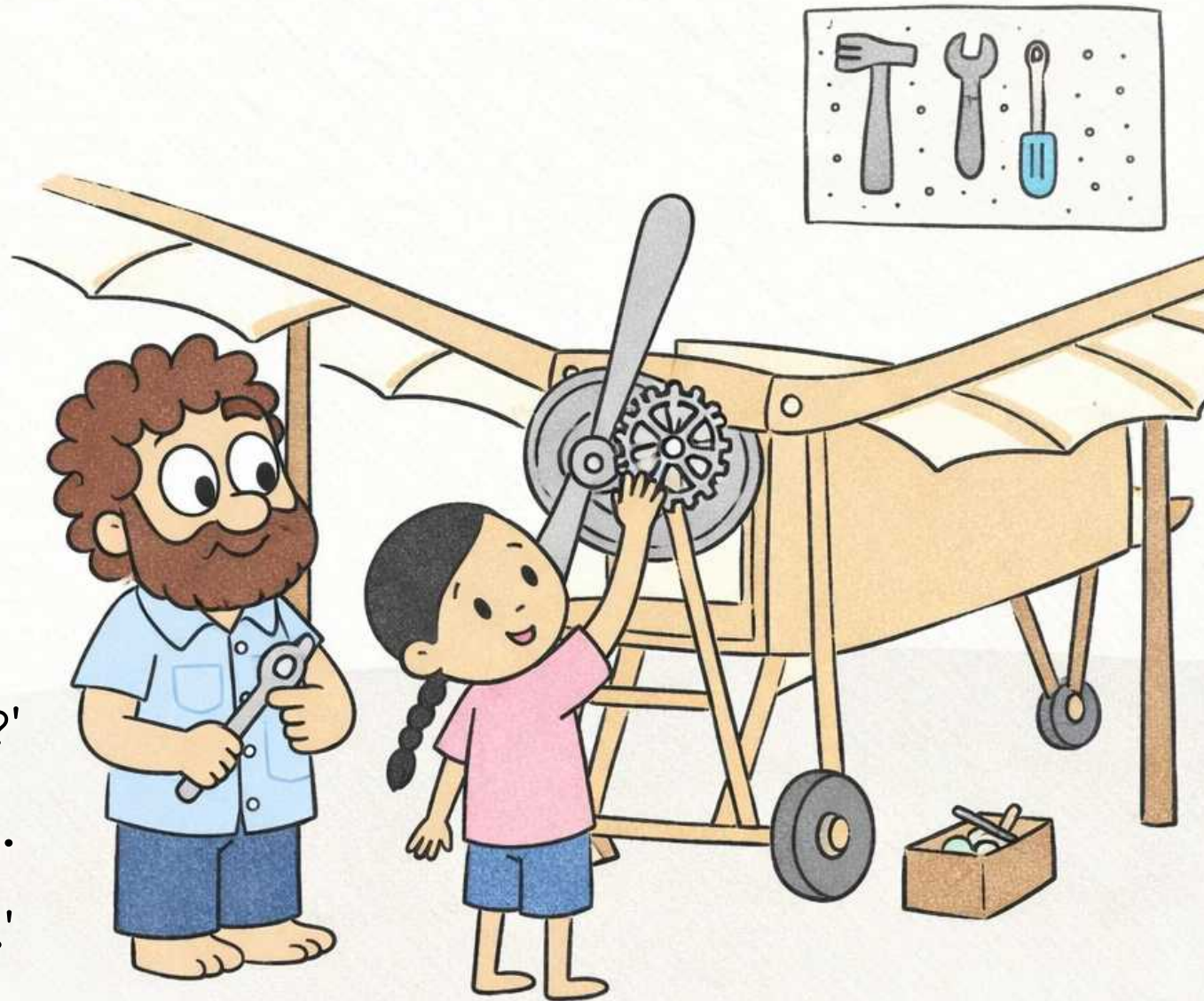




Very hard, it turns out. Panha's plane took off like a rocket. For three seconds, she was flying! Then the wings shook. Then the whole plane fell apart in the air.

Panha crashed into a tree. 'Okay,' she said. 'That was a **mistake**. Time to **redo** it. The next plane won't **explode**.'

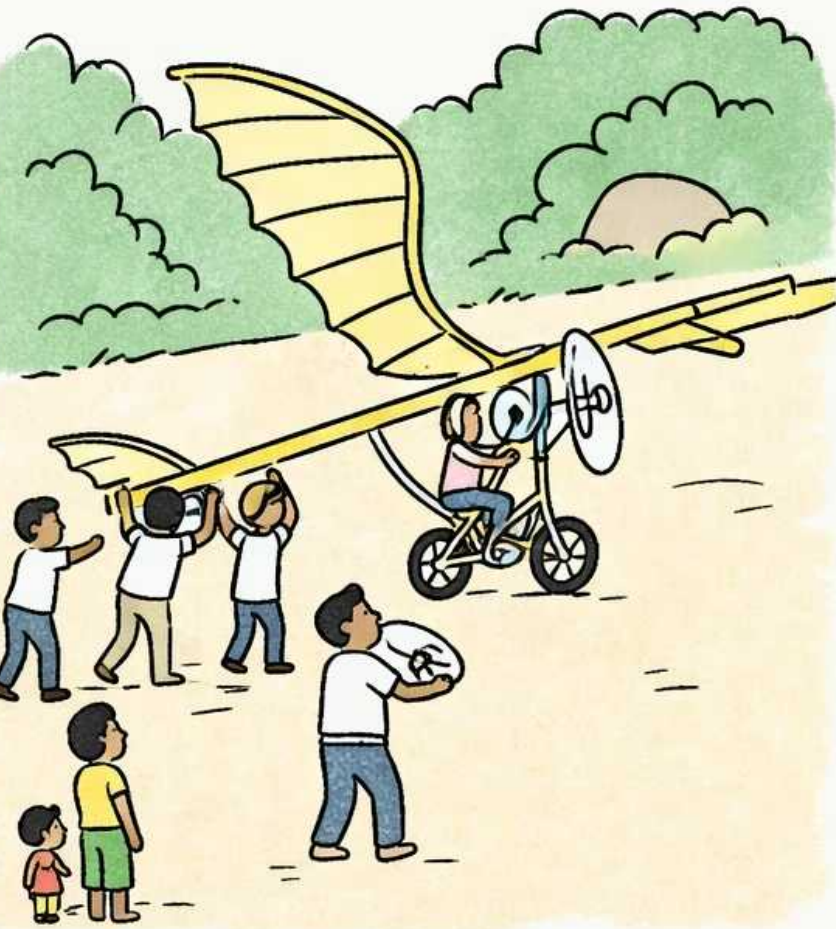

Panha wheeled her plane up the hill. Half the town came to watch. "She'll crash again!" someone whispered.

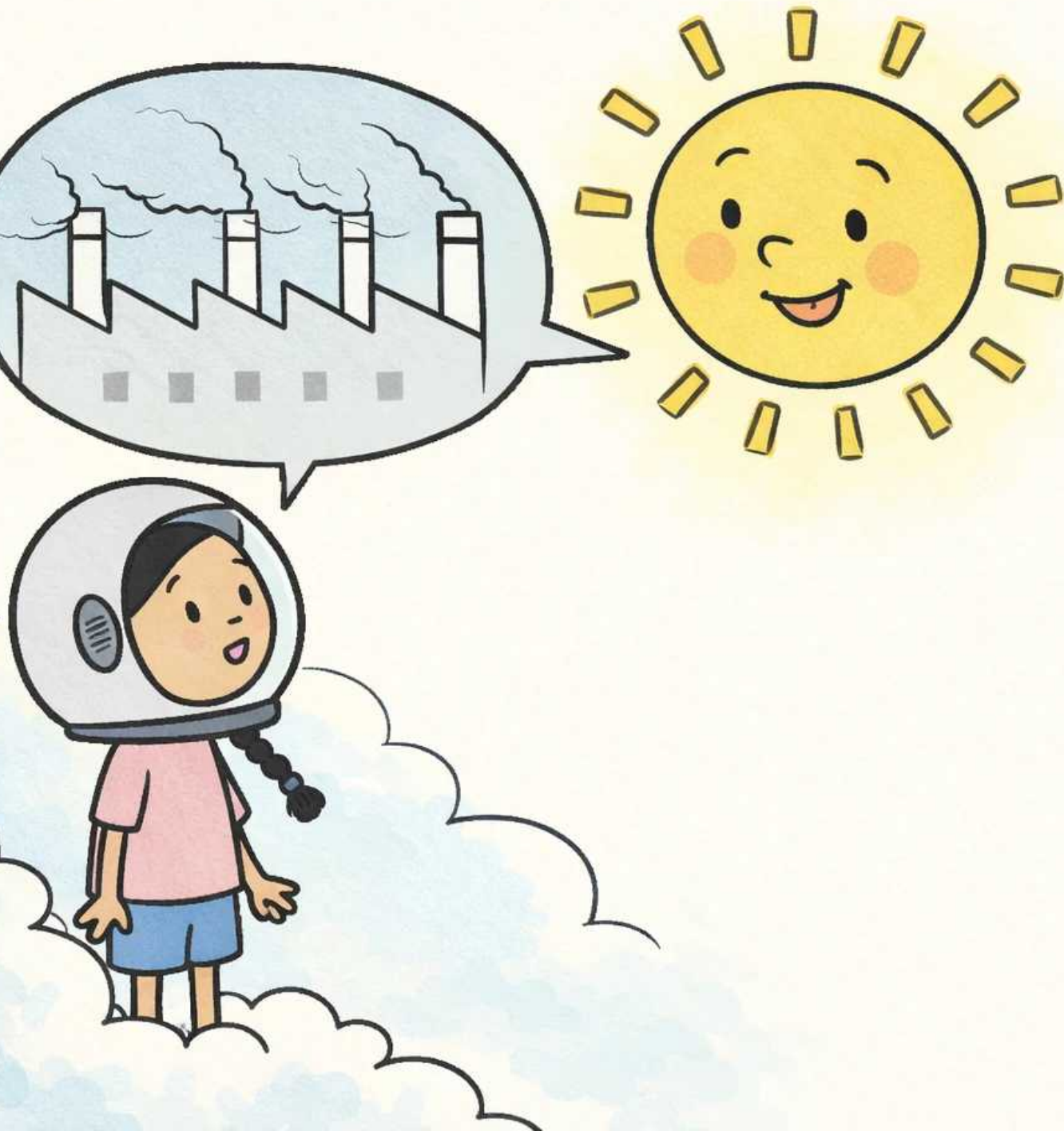
Panha did not care. Dad held out a flight helmet. "Don't return without the sun."

the smog began to thin.





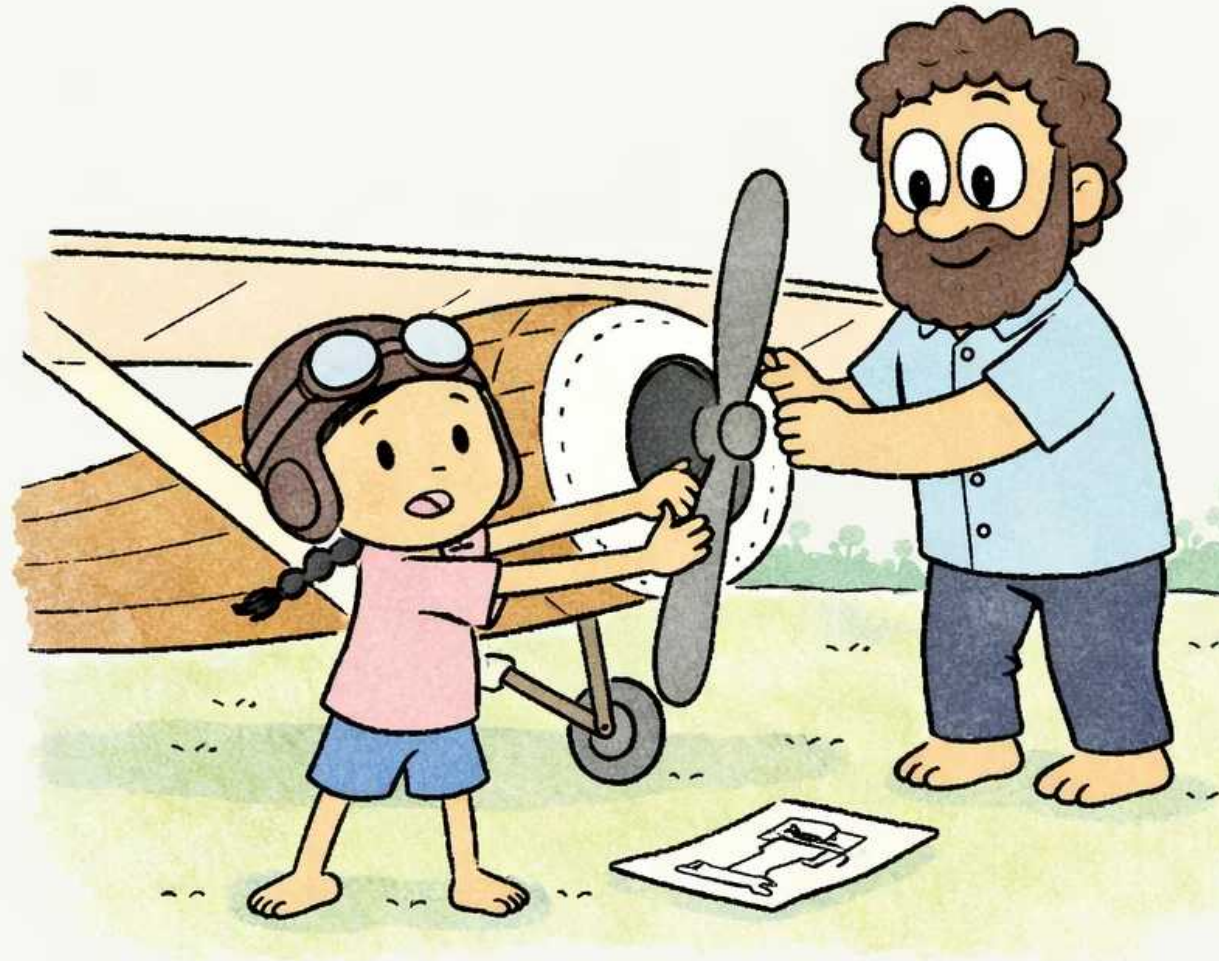
