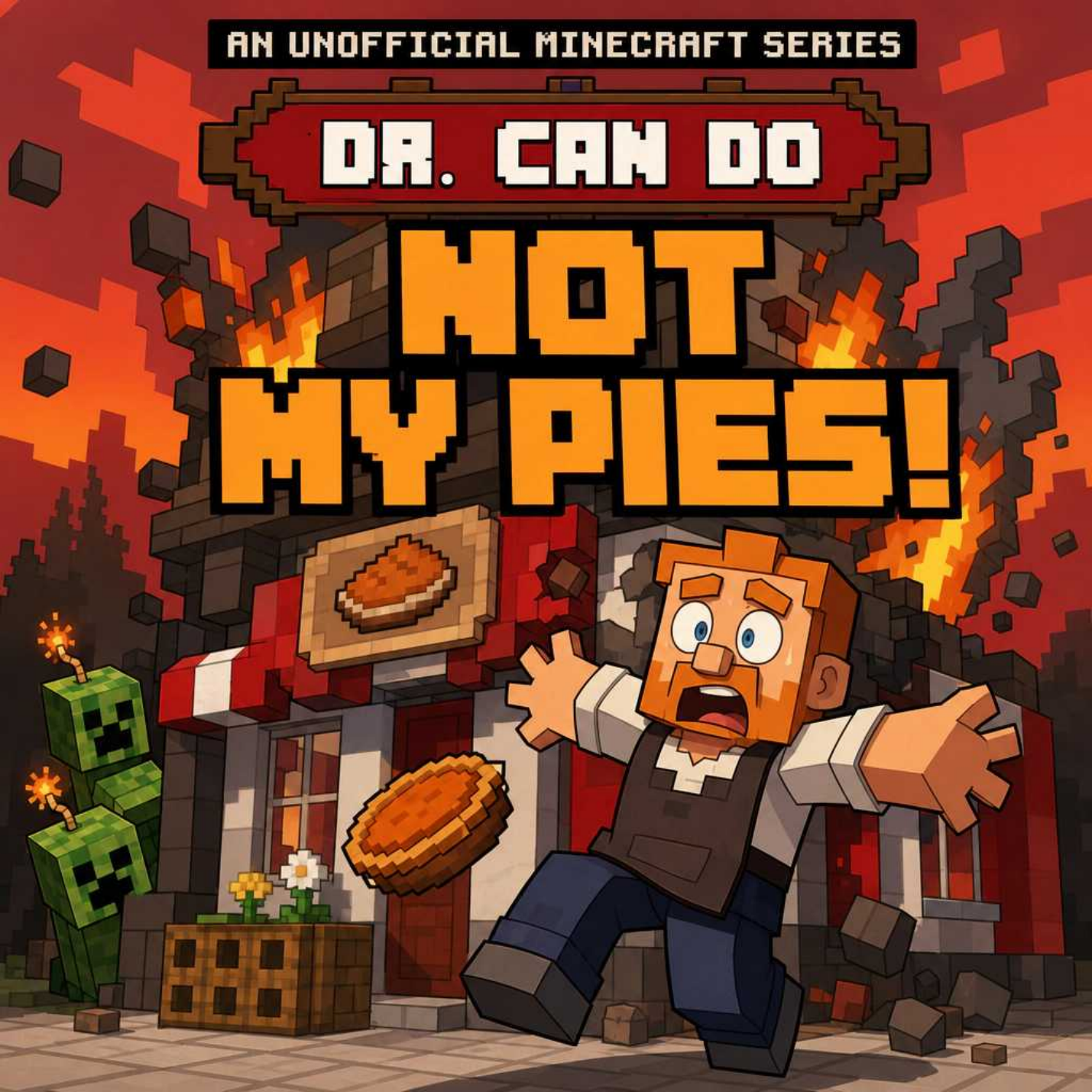

Brutes come out at night. Jill and Mage make guards to fight. But one day Tom feels such grief. Smashed bits! The work of a thief?

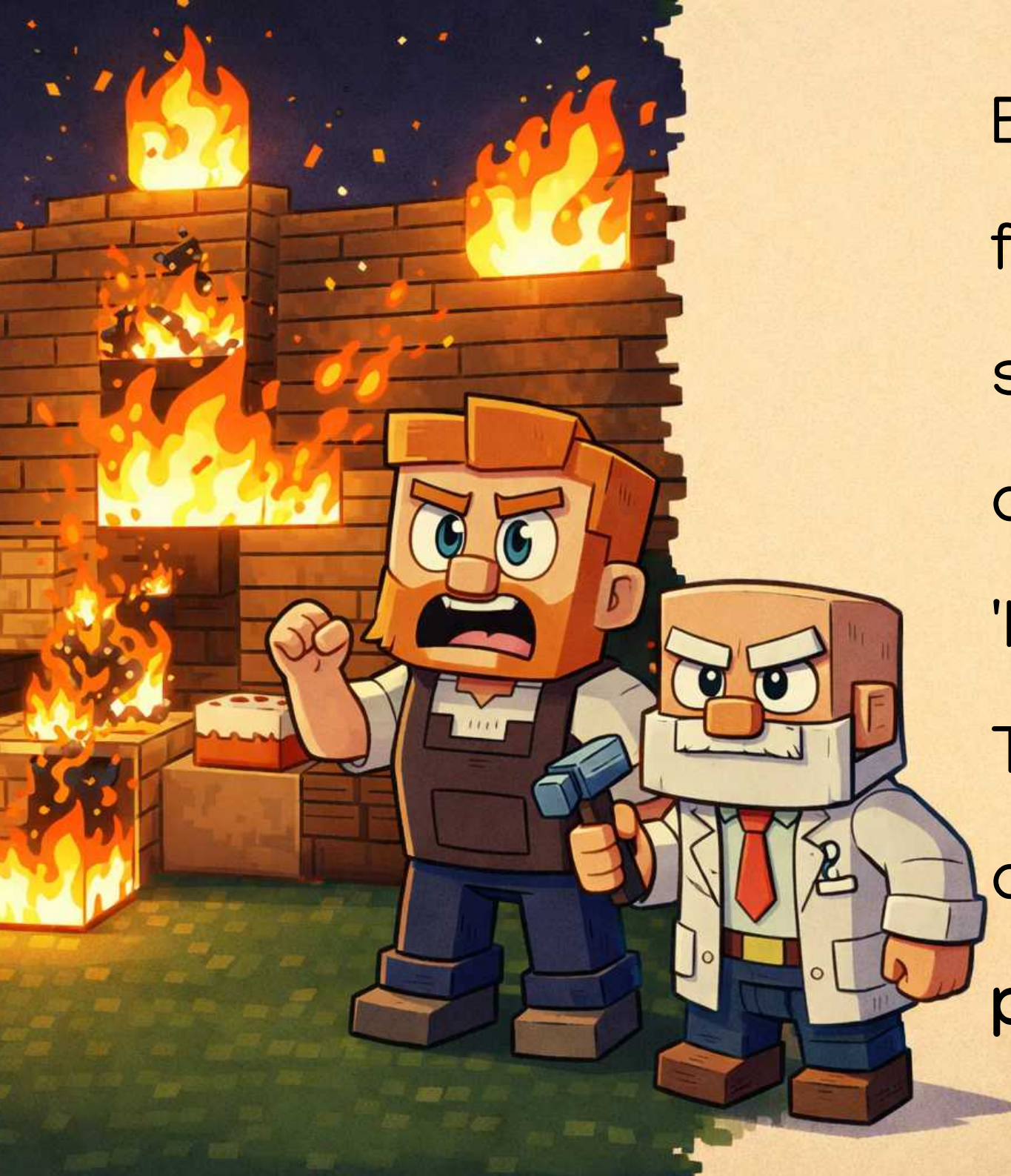
