to find Alex.



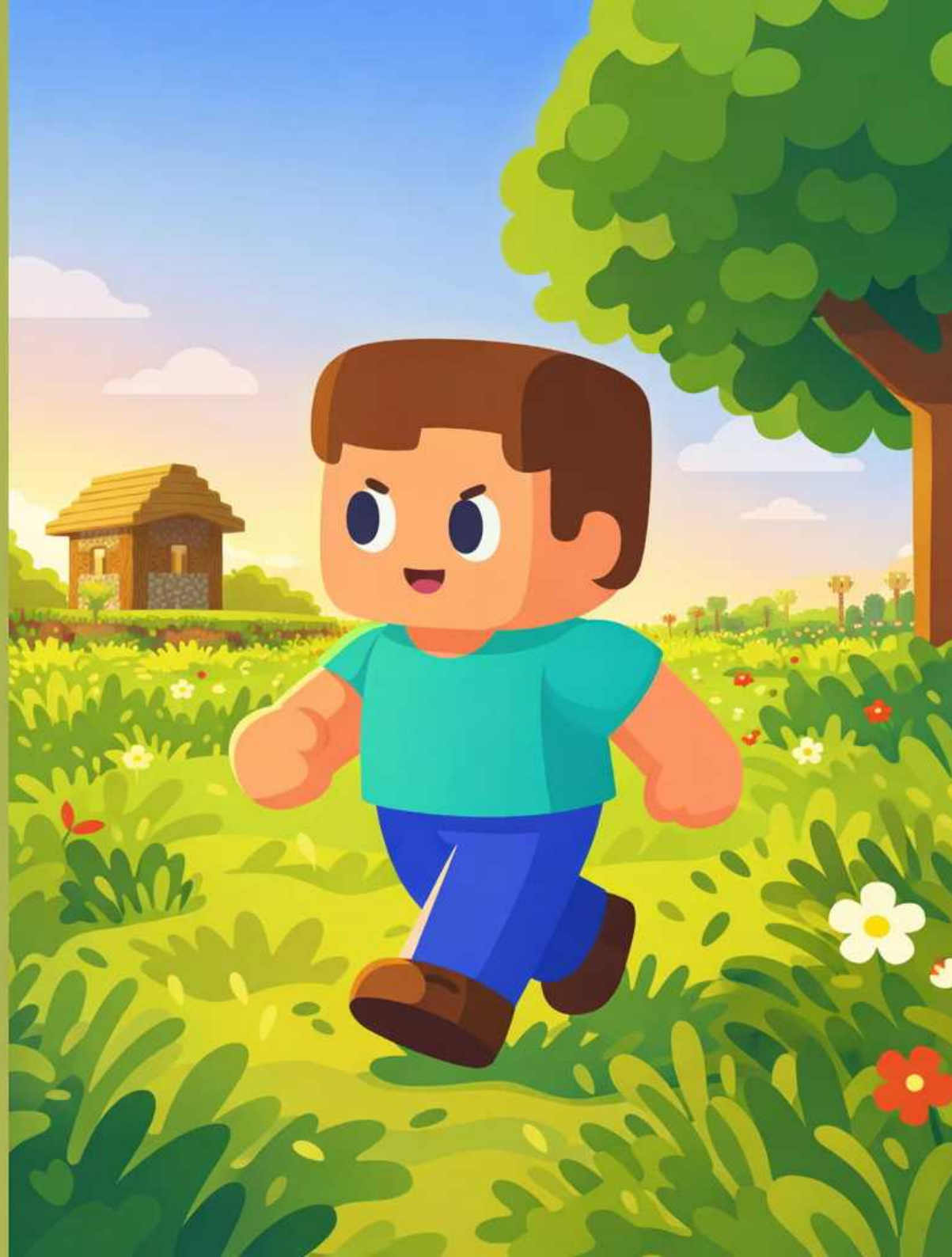


Alex runs off in

He starts to look in the quiet grass.





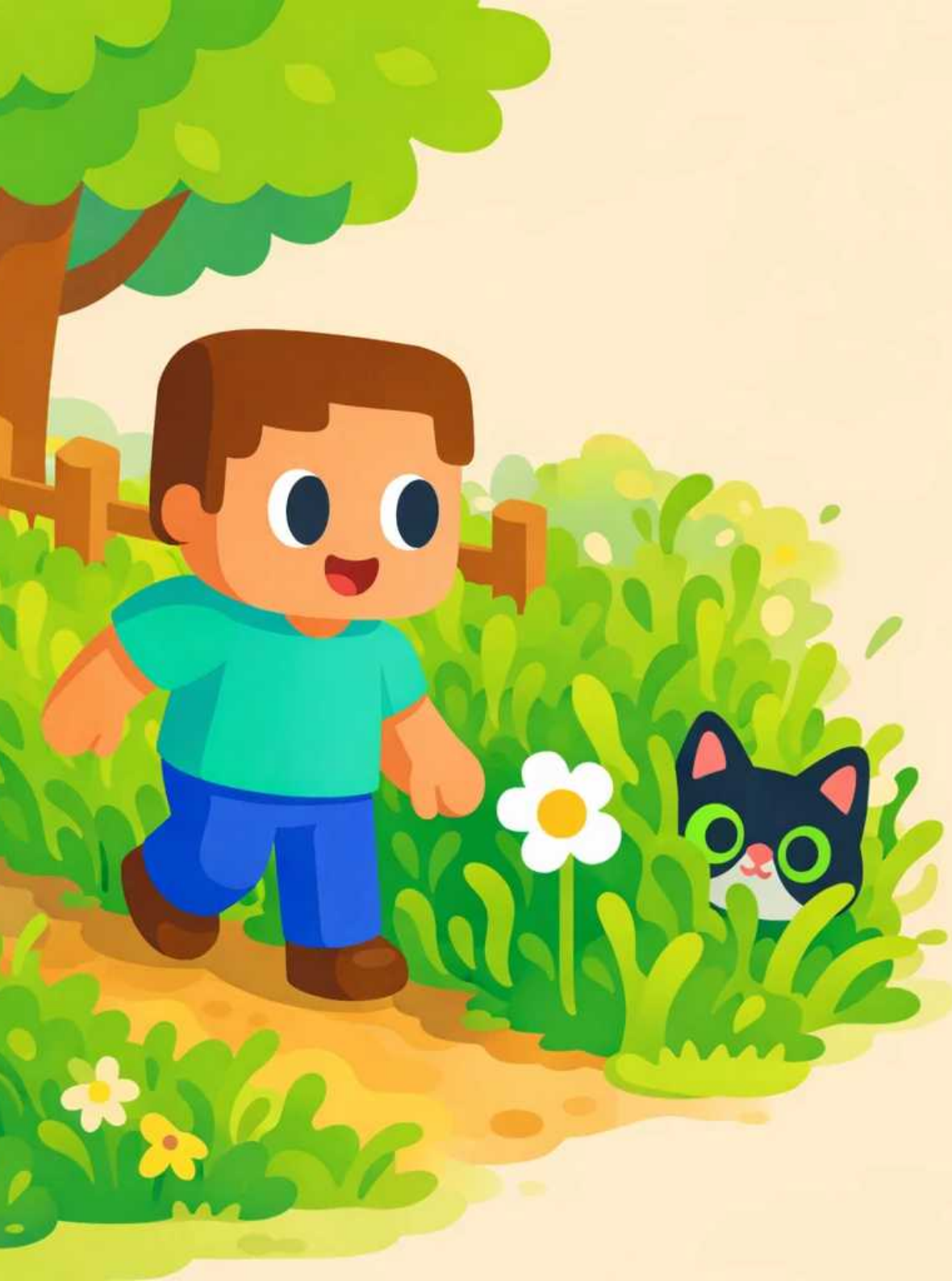
Steve hears the snap of a twig as something walks in the grass.

sniff at stinky things.





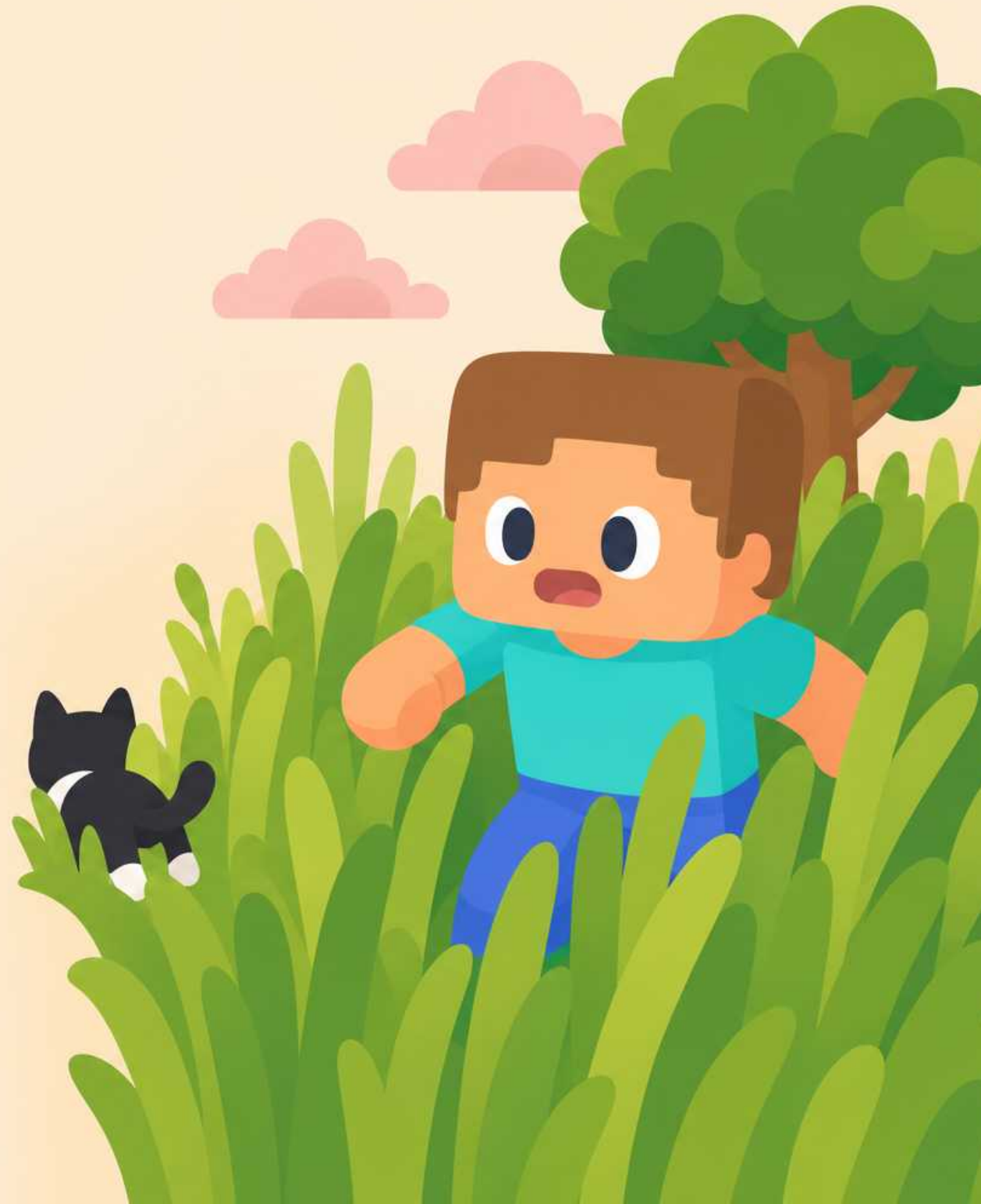
Steve can see
