The world above is bright and **strange**, and Sen cannot wait to see it all!





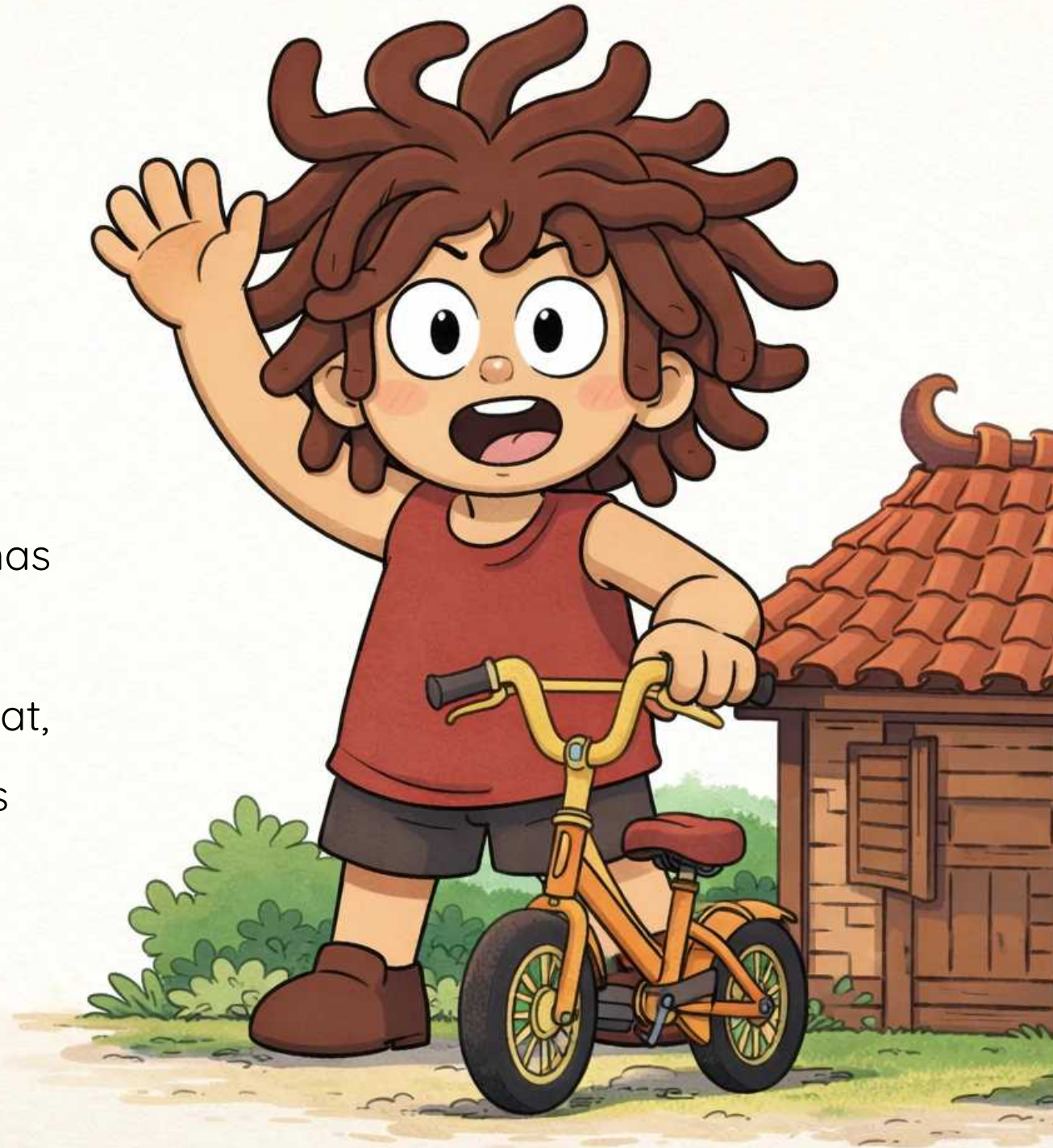
Not far from the cave, three **village** children are playing near the **edge** of the woods. Kem spots something **strange** moving in the distance. 'Look!' he whispers.

After a while, Kem slips outside and sits by the **edge** of the house. He holds the broken bike wheel in his hands and looks toward the woods.

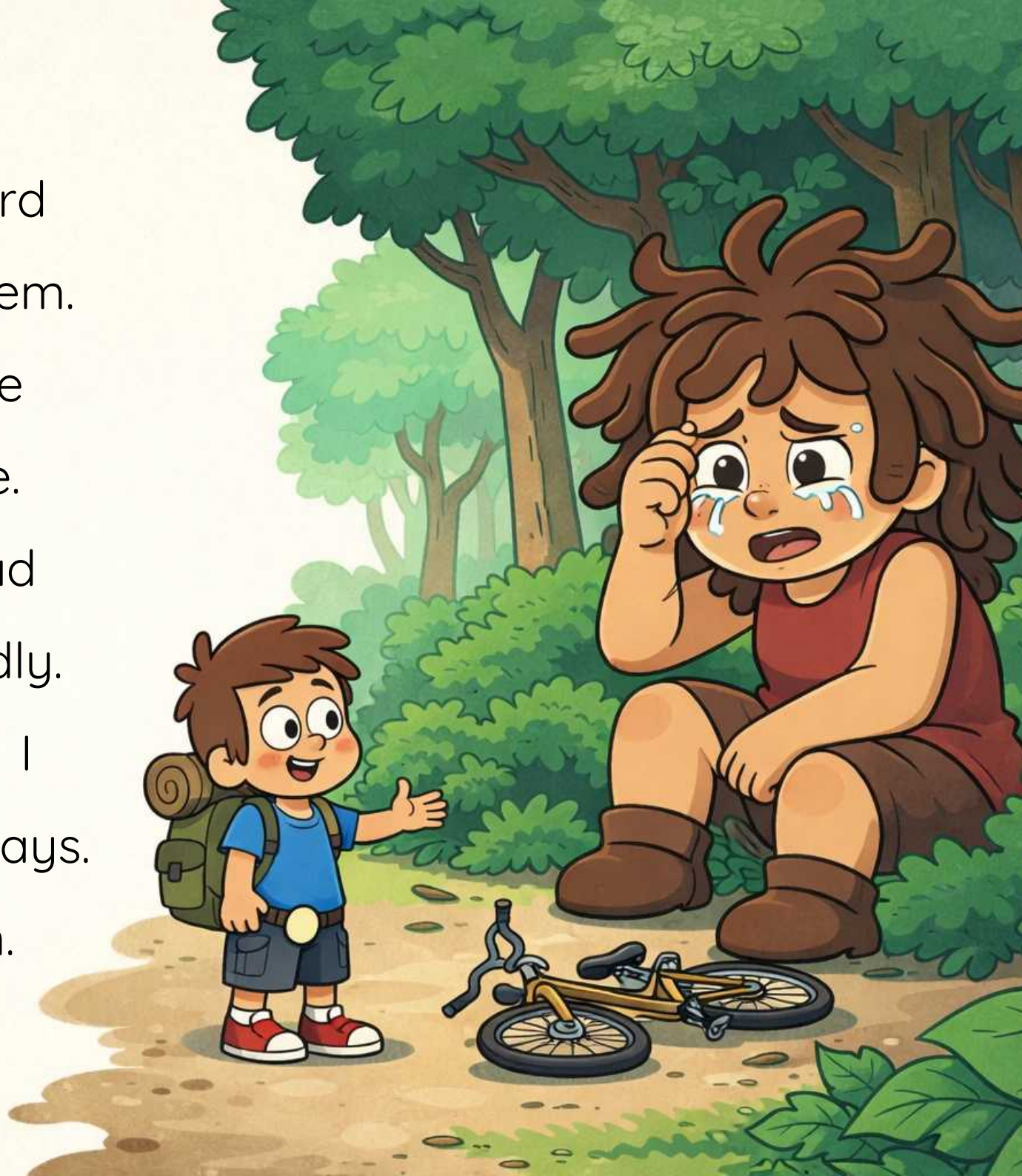
